STEPHEN R. FLEEMAN

Steve Freeman is an Associate Professor of EET at Rock Valley College. He earned an AAS in EET, a BS in ET, and an MS in IED from Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana. While teaching at RVC, he has worked concurrently as an electrical en-

gineer at Hamilton Sundstrand in the areas of Test Equipment Design, and Ground Support Equipment. His work there has supported commercial aircraft, military aircraft, and the Space Shuttle Orbiter. He authored *Electronic Devices: Discrete and Integrated* (Prentice Hall, 1990), and is currently writing a new textbook. Professor Fleeman has been developing methods for applying the EIA Skill Standards to the EET program at Rock Valley College as a means for Student Outcomes Assessment.

THOMAS LOMBARDO

Thomas Lombardo is an Associate Professor of Electronics Engineering Technology at Rock Valley College. He earned an Associate in Applied Science degree in Electrical Technology from Jamestown Community College in Jamestown NY, a Bachelor of Technology in EET from the State University of New York (SUNY) Institute of Technology at Utica/Rome, and a Master of Science in Advanced Technology from Binghamton University. Prior to teaching at Rock Valley College, he was an R&D engineer in the machine tool industry, specializing in microprocessor-based systems.

Professor Lombardo has been active in the distance learning endeavor at RVC since its inception.

Nov and Dec RRVs Mtg Recap

There were over forty people in attendance at the RRVs section/student branch meeting, held annually in November, in the Engineering Building at Northern Illinois University.

After a sumptuous dinner supplied by Yen Ching Restaurant in DeKalb, the audience digested an interesting presentation by Dr. Vincent McGinn. The main topic of his talk was electromagnetic compatibility. He started with an insightful demonstration using a standard light bulb dimmer and a radio. When the light dimmer was turned on, considerable noise could be heard from the radio, clearly demonstrating how common appliances can create electromagnetic interference.

After the demonstration, Dr. McGinn discussed the fundamental causes and problems that can occur with electromagnetic interference. He showed that the fundamentals of electromagnetic compatibility are not that difficult to understand. They can be understood using fundamental principles of physics and basic circuits.

Overall the evening was enjoyable and informative. Everybody seemed to have a pleasant evening and left a little more knowledgeable about electromagnetic compatibility.

Dec

To provide some timely information to section membership about possible problems associated with Y2K, the RRVs held a rare December meeting. Emphasis was on the power grid, and appropriately we brought in a speaker from Com-

monwealth Edison, Steve Nailor.

Mr. Nailor has been in the electric utility business for about 33 years. As public affairs director from the Freeport and Dixon districts, Mr. Nailor has considerable knowledge of Commonwealth Edison's operations.

Because of the holiday season attendance was light, but it was still an enjoyable evening. There was a lively conversation around the dinner table. During this time Mr. Nailor imparted upon those gathered some of his knowledge gained through his many years of experience.

After dinner, a presentation was given. Mr. Nailor said that he could not guarantee that we would have electricity on Jan. 1, 2000, but he could assure us that if there turns out to be no power, the cause would not be attributable to the Y2K computer bug. There are so many other variables in the generation and distribution of power (weather, squirrels, vehicular damage to the utility's equipment, etc.) that are beyond the control of ComEd that it cannot say with certainty that lights will be on during that time. He gave an interesting overview of the electric power system, how the various utilities are interconnected and how the electricity generated comes to the customers. He said one of ComEd's big concerns is that many customers will shut down for the New Year. This could cause an unexpectedly light load and lead to problems in the system. Its best if everyone just acts as if it were a normal holiday weekend.

Overall Steve Nailor assured the audience that Commonwealth Edison should have no problems when it comes to Y2K. The utility should be operating normally when the cal-
