Program The FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) Robotics Competition challenges teams of students and their mentors to solve a common problem in a six-week timeframe using a standard "kit of parts" and a common set of rules. Teams build robots from the parts and enter them in a series of competitions. The Competition has grown to more than 800 teams competing in 23 Regional Events, and The Championship Event held at Reliant Park in Houston where more than 20,000 students participate.

FIRST redefines winning for these students. Teams are rewarded for excellence in design, demonstrated team spirit, gracious professionalism and maturity, and ability to overcome obstacles. Scoring the most points is a secondary goal. Winning means building partnerships that last.

A functioning robot will be shown along with videos and pictures of the team

and robot during development. You will learn how students were changed as a result of their participation. Pictured is last year's robot with a goal in tow, and the Leadership in Controls Award that the team won. (www.usfirst.org)

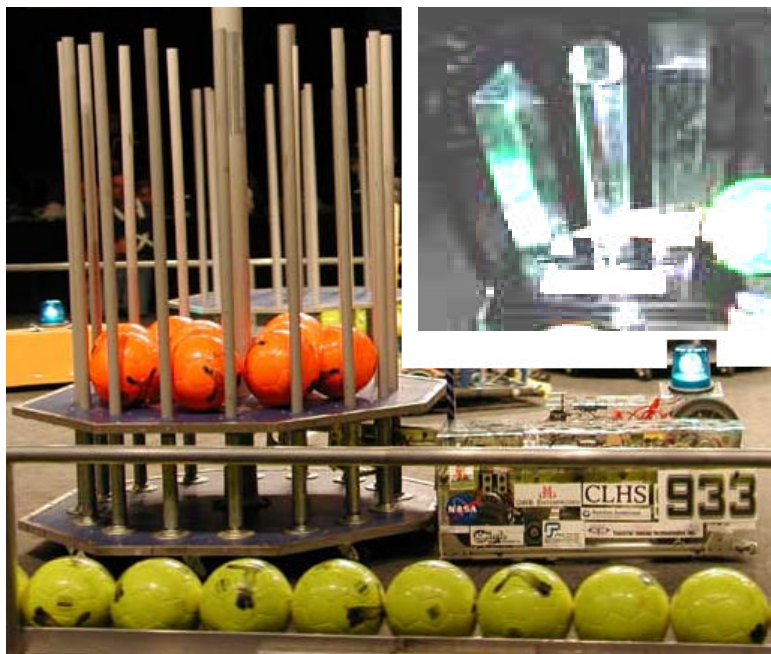
