Program We are the first generation of humans to know what lies beyond the sky. We have floated weightless in the black emptiness, set foot on the gray surface of the



Moon, and sent robot fleets to seven of our eight neighbors. We

have peered with our telescopes into the hearts of exploding stars and nearby galaxies, and we've seen almost to the edge of space-time. And yet, we have merely dipped our toes into the ocean of the cosmos. So much remains to be explored and discovered, even within our own neighborhood of the solar system, including liquid oceans on Jupiter's moons, and ancient dry lakes and rivers on Mars. What lies beyond beckons. How soon will we embark on the vision of Carl Sagan: "We have lingered long enough on the shores of the cosmic ocean. We are ready at last to set sail for the stars"?

Speaker Mr. Donald T. Palac manages NASA John H. Glenn Research Center's Rocket-Based Combined Cycle Program, an effort to combine rocket and jet engine propulsion to enable routine access to space. He joined the NASA staff in 1987.

He has served as a manager of projects and people in developing advanced concepts for space science and exploration. He managed the design of new rocket engines and power systems for the exploration of the Moon and Mars, oversaw development of experiments for the Mars Pathfinder rover, headed a team to develop a science mission to the Moon and a comet using a new

electric rocket engine, and has served on NASA-wide committees that developed strategic planning and NASA's vision for the future.

Prior to joining NASA, Don served ten years with the United States Air Force, where he helped design and prepare for launch the early warning satellites that were used against Iraqi Scud missiles in the Persian Gulf War.

A native of Carpentersville, Illinois, Don earned a BS in Aeronautical and Astronautical Engineering from Purdue University, an MS in Astronautical Engineering from the Air Force Institute of Technology and an MBA from California State University at Dominguez Hills, Carson, California.

Chicago/Rockford IEEE Consultants' Network Meeting

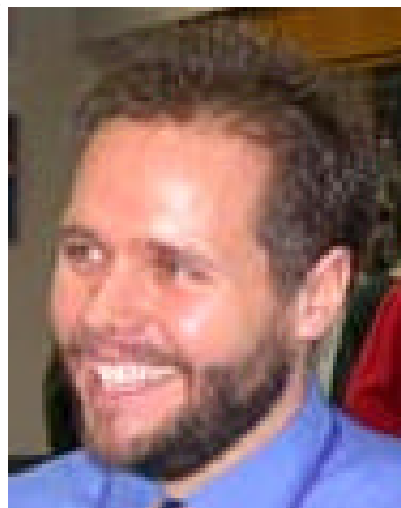

Mr. Brian Kluck, an advanced math and physics teacher at Christian Life High School, and an ensemble of high school students and mentors from companies in the community gave an inspiring overview of the US FIRST robot project in which they have been involved, which allows the team only six weeks to design, develop and test a robot capable of stacking bins on top of each other. Brian's team had just shipped the robot to the US FIRST Regional Competition two days before this meeting. Attendees were treated to an interesting and highly motivating presentation format that included video of last year's competition, animated clips showing year's competition, posters of the team's development of this year's robot, live testimonies from the students on the project as well as from the mentors that provided guidance to the students, and finally, a live demonstration of last year's robot.
