Program The confluence of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attack and the U.S. Army's historic role to support civil authorities has resulted in substantial new challenges for the Army. To help meet these challenges, the Assistant Secretary of the Army for Research and Technology requested the National Research Council (NRC) carry out a series of studies on how science and technology could assist the Army prepare for its role in homeland security (HLS). The National Academies Board on Army Science and Technology formed the Committee on Army Science and Technology for Homeland Security to accomplish that assignment. The Committee was asked to review relevant literature and activities, determine areas of emphasis for Army S&T in support of counter terrorism and anti-terrorism, and recommend high-payoff technologies to help the Army fulfill its mission. Dr. Dutta has been one of the members of this Committee. The re-

sults of the first report will be discussed.

Speaker Dr. Mitra Dutta is professor and head of the department of electrical and computer engineering at the University of Illinois at Chicago. For fifteen years previously, she served in various capacities at the US Army Research Laboratory, including a Senior Executive Service position in the Army Research Office (ARO). In this position, Dr. Dutta provided oversight of the entire ARO extramural basic research program, as well as the leadership for the integration and transition of the ARO-executed Department of Defense, Department of the Army, and Army Materiel Command research activities. Dr. Dutta's recent research focused on III-V and III-N semiconductors, including the design, demonstration, and characterization of novel optoelectronic and quantum electronic devices.
