Fuel Cells and Fuel Reformers for Portable and Non-Portable Power Sources

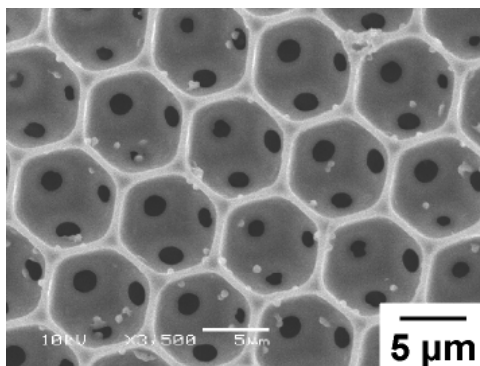

Program

The presentation will begin with an introduction to the present status of R&D on fuel cell-based power sources for stationary, portable, and transport applications.

I will highlight the development of all-ceramic microreactors for in situ hydrogen production by reforming of safer, easier to store liquid fuels.

Second, I will discuss a unique approach to develop direct liquid fuel cells for portable applications. Laminar flow is exploited to create a microfluidic fuel cell that lacks the usual polymer electrolyte membrane. This membraneless fuel cell design eliminates several of the technical issues related to the use of polymer electrolyte membranes including the occur-

rence of fuel crossover, membrane dry out, and limitations to the chemistries and media being used. The design, fabrication, key performance characteristics of these fuel flexible membraneless fuel cells will be presented. Also, scaling challenges to obtain, for example, 20W fuel cell-battery hybrid systems for battery recharging applications will be discussed.

I will conclude with sharing some thoughts on the short and long term future of different fuel cell-based technologies and approaches for power sources for portable and transport applications.

Paul J.A. Kenis, Ph.D.

is an assistant Professor in the Department of Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering at the University of Illinois at

Urbana-Champaign, Professor Kenis received his MS in Chemistry from Nijmegen University, (1993) and his Ph.D. degree in Chemical Engineering from Twente University, (1997), both in The Netherlands. Other current projects include the development of platforms for biological cell studies, and micro/nanofluidic tools for nano-manufacturing.

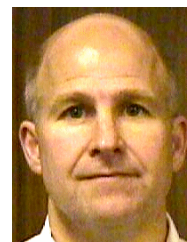
