**Program** In a typical day, we use many different tools to get us to work, help us work, help us cook, keep us

entertained and informed, and make our environments more comfortable. So many of the products that we take for granted today contain software controlled processors. From microwave ovens to the many systems in our automobiles. From the airplanes we fly on business to the thermostats that keep our homes and offices comfortable. Many of these systems are safety critical, yet we take it for granted that these systems are reliable enough. Thus, we need not spend our precious time worrying about whether our car will suddenly start anti-lock braking when it shouldn't, or our thermostats won't enter a state where they command the furnace or air-conditioning 'full on'. How can we rest

## September Meeting Recap

Dr. Joachim Holtz, a prominent professor from Wuppertal University, Germany, is the first international distinguished lecturer to be invited to a RRVS meeting. The relatively large Friday evening turnout was gratifying. Dr. Holtz lectured on a need for a clear and comprehensive description of the dynamic behavior of AC machines for their application in drive systems. First, he showed the limitations of the standard and well known methods of space vectors and Parks Transformation. Dr. Holtz' novel approach is based on complex state variables that relate the transient conditions to the propagation in space of distributed magnetic fields. The mathematical model developed accurately represented transient machine behavior that heretofore was not explained with the standard methods mentioned above. Dr Holtz' clear and straightforward style made his presentation easy to understand.
