Program True Sensorless (Self-Sensing) Control of AC Drives including Zero Speed Operation.

Controlled operation of AC drives, both PM and Induction, without mechanical position/velocity sensors at zero and high speeds has long been a goal for both drive manufacturers and researchers. The reliability advantages and cost advantages have driven this quest. Within the last several years significant research breakthroughs have occurred. Zero speed sensorless (self-sensing) techniques have been developed, demonstrated, and are now operating in applications which would not be practical without this technology. This presentation will discuss

the basic techniques involved in this rapidly emerging technology.

Speaker Dr. Bob Lorenz is a

Full Professor in both Mechanical Engineering and in Electrical and Computer Engineering at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He is also Co-Director of the Wisconsin Electric Machines and Power Electronics Consortium, "WEMPEC", which has 63 industrial sponsors and is celebrating its 17th anniversary this year. His interests are in control and estimation in power converters and drives.

Before joining the faculty he worked 12 years in industry and is very familiar with precision control of electrical drives. Since joining the University 13 years ago, he has over 90 publications, 12 patents issued and 13 prize

paper awards from the IEEE, Industry Applications Society and its international counterparts in Japan and Europe.

He regularly spends considerable time at the Technical University of Aachen, Germany, (including 3 weeks last summer) in the Electrical Drives and Power Electronics Institute, the Electrical Machines Institute and in the Machine Tool and Production Engineering Institute. He speaks German and Spanish fluently.

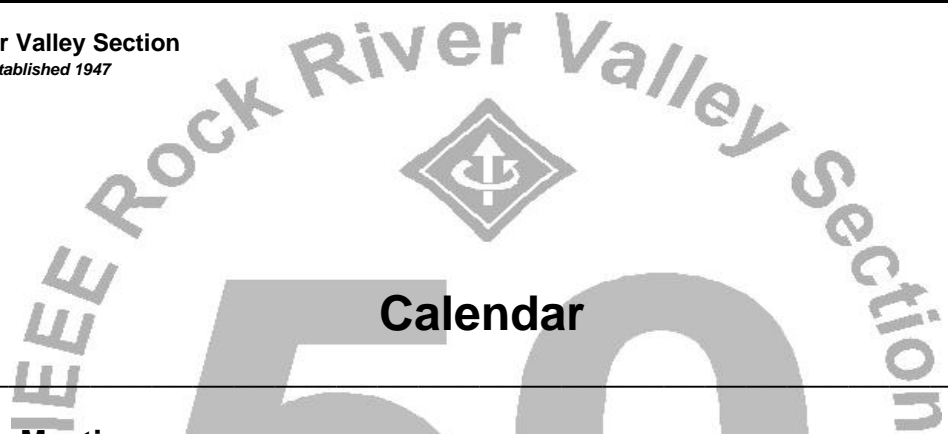
