Byron Nuclear Station Tour

When April 24, 1997

Where Byron Nuclear Power Plant, Byron, IL

From Rockford take bypass 20 toward Freeport. Exit on route 2 to Byron. Turn left at first stop light in Byron. At the next stop sign go straight. This is German Church Road. Follow this road 4-5 miles to the power plant. The road will twist and turn. Turn right into the power plant and right again to the Training building.

Program Tour of Byron Station Training Facility and Simulator Room.

Byron Station is one of Commonwealth Edison's Nuclear Generating plants located in Byron, IL. The Byron reactor is called a Pressurized Water Reactor (PWR). Made of eight-inch-thick steel and located inside a building made of reinforced concrete, the reactor vessel holds long metal tubes - called fuel rods - which contain uranium fuel. When uranium atoms are split in a process called nuclear fission,

a huge amount of heat is generated and allowed to heat the water surrounding the fuel rods which is kept under pressure to prevent boiling.

The Pressurized water flows into steam generators, where its heat is used to produce steam that is then directed into a turbine. The turbine which is directly coupled to a 1,175,055 kilowatt generator, spins at the speed of 1,800 revolutions per minute. The result is energy.

After passing through the turbine, the steam is cooled in condensers and becomes water that will go through the entire process again and again.

The generator output is 25,000 volts which is stepped up to 345,000 volts by two transformers.

In the simulator room, conditions such as those that existed at Three Mile Island can be duplicated so operators can be trained on how to react to similar conditions.
