February Meeting Recap

Prof. Lofti Zadeh, the Father of Fuzzy Logic, presented *Computing with Words; A New Paradigm* at our 2nd Annual Joint IEEE/ASME RRVS meeting set to coincide with National Engineers Week. An outstanding meal including carved prime rib was enjoyed by dinner attendees at this special event. Prof. Zadeh described how natural languages are systems to describe perceptions. The human brain can easily process perceptions, yet computers find it difficult to process perceptual information. Prof. Zadeh is developing a Computation Theory of Perceptions to move computers in the direction of being able to process perceptions. Words are used in fuzzy logic because it's cheaper; the less resolution, less accuracy, the cheaper things are. "Precision carries a cost". Soft computing, a basket of computing methodologies including fuzzy logic, neurocomputing, evolutionary computing, probabilistic computing and machine learning, will be needed to elevate current computer technology to be able to process perceptions.
